

## **ELECTRICAL CURRENT**

The usual voltage throughout Africa is 240 volts, 50 cycles. You will need to bring a 3 prong adapter with you to use your 110-120 AC (normal currency in U.S.) for things such as charger for video or digital camera etc.

Since the plug ins can vary, it is best to purchase a kit that has several different adapters in it to be sure you have on that will work. Safari Legacy recommends specifically the British square pin variety. It is my understanding that both camps have 24 hour electricity - a true luxury. But still be prepared with extra batteries.

NOTE: there is 24 hour electricity at Fairmont and Ol Pejeta. For those traveling to the Mara, they are on a generator so will not have 24 hour electricity. We will find out when we get there. Just remember you will need your flashlight at night to go to the bathroom so keep near, and you will only be able to charge your batteries or devices during the day.

## **WATER**

Remember you are in Africa - water is at a premium. It has to be trucked into the lodges to accommodate the guests needs. You should not plan on showering several times a day like you might do at home. A quick wash with washcloth out of the sink may have to suffice in between daily showers. The water has to be heated each morning by the staff so sometimes it is not as hot as you would like prior to our early morning game drives. I suggest showering the night before.
